BLACKFORD DEVELOPMENT

After almost a year of meetings and negotiations with Ball Homes and the LFUCG Planning Division, an acceptable plan for the **Blackford Development** was reached and unanimously approved by the the Planning Commission. The development will not be a mirror of Greenbrier, but rather a complimentary development. The entire neighborhood will be divided into small segments delineated by trees and will contain walking and biking trails and green areas.

A stormwater basin has been added behind Katkay to contain run-off from coming into Greenbrier. No vehicular traffic will enter Walnut Grove or Deer Haven from this development to keep traffic at current levels. Additionally, Ball has been

required to add a new sewer trunk line which will ultimately replace the old trunk which currently serves Greenbrier. The new trunk will be on Winchester Road and we will go online at it's completion.

GOOD NEIGHBOR TIPS

Occasionally questions arise about various neighborhood activities or actions. There are two methods of intervention for problems. First are Deed Restrictions over which the GRA Board has authority and enforcement powers. The deed restrictions are on the web site and can be downloaded and printed for reference. Second are city ordinances which are enforced by LFUCG. City ordinances are also on the website. Calling 311 will connect you with a person who will follow up on ordinance violations without identifying the complaining party. The GRA will not call 311 for you.

The usual offenses that neighbors complain about include curbing your dog in their yards, parking vehicles on the street for extended periods, unkempt yards, and dead trees that need to be removed. If you have a complaint please approach your neighbor in a friendly manner to discuss the problem. Anonymous notes do nothing to solve the problem and only serve to alienate neighbors. Greenbrier is not a neighborhood that wants that type of reputation. The Golden Rule is certainly what we hope to live by.
