There have been several home burglaries this year which have fortunately not resulted in any personal injury, but which have, nonetheless, caused uneasiness among residents. Vehicles parked in driveways and on the streets have also been the target of thieves, be they window smashers or more unsophisticated types who take advantage of unlocked car doors. The LFUCG Division of Police says Lexington neighborhoods are experiencing these types of crime from one end of the county to the other. We are fortunate in that we have security cameras which have helped in the arrest of one of the alleged burglars. Currently our camera technology is somewhat limited and requires many hours of time to find the specific day, time and frame to identify the suspect vehicle. The GRA is hoping to be able to afford one or two updated cameras which will be high definition and have infrared technology to capture images at night.

After one recent burglary, the GRA was approached by our friends at the Greenbrier Golf and Country Club with an offer we can't refuse! The Club has generously offered to contribute to our enhanced camera purchase through a proposal that is linked to neighborhood club memberships.
